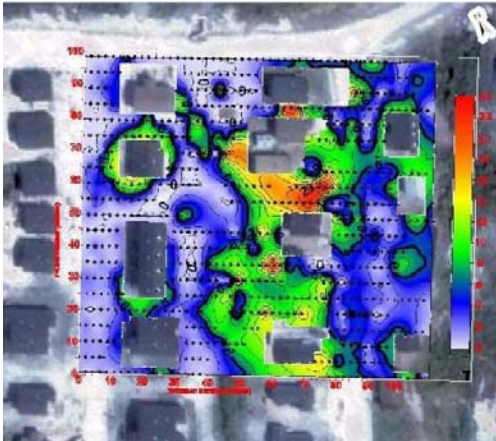

Project Description:

In Hopedale, there is some evidence that a residential subdivision may be impacted by a former landfill with metals and oil-like substances surfacing in some areas.

An electromagnetic (EM) survey was undertaken in 2006 to determine the extent of the landfill as evidenced by the presence of subsurface metals.

A further EM survey was conducted in 2007 to further delineate the area of concern, especially adjacent to and beneath houses and private property.

A report on the findings and recommendations on further delineation and remediation options was prepared and submitted to the Nunatsiavut Government.
